

CSR Imperial Individual Event Notes

Wednesday 3rd July – Sunday 7th July 2024

• Programme & Entry Fees:

• Wednesday: Imperial Match - £45.00

o Thursday: 100/200/300 Matches, Long Range Rural Match Match - £25.00 each

o Friday: Urban Match, Short Range Match - £25.00 each

o Saturday: Rural Match - £41.00

• Under 25 Discount: 40% discount off entry fee for those that are under 25 years old on the day of the Event

Meeting Membership: £14.50

• Entry Deadline: Thursday 27th June at midday

• Cancellations: Cancellations must be received via email to squadding@nra.org.uk by 8am two working days prior to each competition. i.e. if you wish to cancel your entry to the Rural Match on Saturday 6th July, you must send a cancellation via email before 8am Thursday 4th July. Entries cancelled in time will be fully refunded (or credited), after this point entries are non-refundable. Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of cancellation. Any uncompleted aggregates will also be refunded/ credited as per this policy

• Entry Requirements:

- ✓ **Shooter Certification Card (SCC):** Each civilian shooting on a MoD or NRA range has to carry a SCC issued by the chairman of a club of which they are a member and which is affiliated to the NRA. Competitors MUST be in possession of their SCC when shooting on NRA ranges. If you do not have an SCC for the type of firearm you wish to participate with please contact the Competition Co-ordinator before entering
- ✓ This competition is open to members of Home Office Approved Clubs (HOAC) who are not prohibited under section 21 of the Firearms Act (The NRA is the largest HOAC in the UK). Non-NRA members are welcome, but are required to pay an additional Meeting Member Fee
- ✓ On the first day of the Competition you must be aged 14 or over (please contact the Competition Coordinator before entering if this is not the case)
- **Making an entry:** Entries can be made and paid for online via: <u>online.nra.org.uk</u>. A downloadable paper entry form will also be available which can be returned via email or post
- **Gallery Rifle ID (GRID):** This is a unique index number that allows us to match up your scores from multiple CSR League Meetings, and is also used for the CSR Imperial and Action Weekend Competitions. Your GRID is listed on your membership profile and on our online booking website: online.nra.org.uk/customer/info

Classes:

Historic Enfield: Any SMLE/ No.4/ No. 5 rifle, service pattern as issued, with no attachments
 Any Iron: Any rifle with iron sights, with no restriction on slings (but rests may not be used)

o Service Optic: Any rifle with optic sights, max 4.5 magnification with no restriction on slings. Rests may

not be used. (Any vertical or angled fore grip, if fitted, may be used)

o Practical Optic: Any rifle with optic sights, with no restriction on slings or rests. Bipods must remain in

the folded or retracted state at the start of a stage and may only be deployed when on the firing point and moving into the final firing position. A bipod must remain fitted to

the firearm for the duration of the Stage or Practice

- Classifications: Each match in the Imperial Programme has its own Classification boundaries (see CSR Handbook). Within each firearm class shooters will be divided into classification groups based on the highest score they achieved in the three years prior to the current Meeting. New shooters to the CSR Imperial will be placed in the lowest class
- **Courses of Fire:** Conditions and courses of fire are listed in the CSR Handbook which can be found <u>online</u> and in a FREE paperback book available from NRA Reception
- Muzzle Energy: Ranges at Bisley use the Danger Area of Pirbright Range, which under MoD requirements state that all firearms used must either have a muzzle energy under 4,500 Joules (3,319 ft lbs), or else be zeroed at 200 yards or on the Bisley Zero Range prior to being used at a longer distance. If your ME exceeds the limit then you must zero your rifle, using the specially designed target, the day before the start of your particular Meeting

- **Firing Positions:** Prone, sitting, kneeling and standing. Para A3.2.22 of the CSR Handbook: A firer who has a physical disability (temporary or permanent) which prevents the use of a position specified in the match conditions may assume the next most difficult position instead. The CRO, RO and the MD must be informed before the start of the match. The following substitutions are among those permitted:
 - o a. The sitting position instead of the prone position
 - o b. The kneeling position instead of the sitting position
 - o c. The standing position instead of the kneeling position
 - o d. The kneeling unsupported position (either on two knees or on one knee without resting the elbow on the knee) instead of the standing position
- **Squadding:** Once entries have closed will be 'squadded' for each match into a specific group that will rotate between firing the competitions and operating targetry in the Butts. On Century range there will always be two groups on the firing point, and two in the butts at any time. If you are physically unable to operate targets there should be additional competitors available to assist. Once entries to the event have closed, you will be emailed a copy of the squadding which can be found here: nra.org.uk/csrsquadding/
- **Special Squadding Requests:** You will be squadded randomly, with the exception of those supervising junior shooters, those new to CSR, or those sharing firearms. If you wish to request special squadding please make a note on your entry
- On the Day: Please head straight to the range for the pre-event briefing do not go to NRA Reception
- **Results:** Results will be input on the day of the Competition and will be available online: www.nra.org.uk/liveresults
- Challenging Results: It is the competitor's responsibility on the day of the competition to ensure that the Wing Officer records their scores correctly. Any challenges of this nature must be made immediately on the day. Following the publishing of scores online competitors have until midday on the Thursday of the following week to contact the NRA for errors relating to the digitising of the hand recorded scores. Please email competitions@nra.org.uk with any challenges
- **Firearms Usage:** The NRA is required to keep a record of firearms used by competitors as required by the Firearms (Amendment) Acts 1997. Following a Competition please go to your online profile and update your firearms usage: online.nra.org.uk/customer/firearmusages
- **Awards:** NRA Medals are awarded to each Competition, in each firearm class, for each classification group, subject to Prize List D of the NRA handbook:

o 2+ Entries: Gold Medal

o 6+ Entries: Gold and Silver Medal

o 11+ Entries: Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal

Additional Prizes are awarded, care of our sponsors Aim Field Sports, Vortex Optics & RPI Ltd. for the Rural, Urban match & Falling Plates see the NRA Handbook for full details

• **Prizegiving:** Prizegiving (and annual BBQ) will take place on Saturday 6th July 2024, following the completion of the Individual CSR Imperial Competitions, venue to be confirmed. Prizegiving will start with the presentation of CSR Winter League awards for the 2023/24 season

BBQ: If you wish to join your fellow shooters for a BBQ buffet, you must pre-purchase a BBQ ticket, which is available when you book your competition entry



Terms of Entry:

- I agree I meet the entry criteria as stated in these Event Notes
- I confirm that the information given on the attached Entry form is true, complete and accurate

Access to firearms:

- I meet at least one of the following conditions that legitimises my access to firearms:
 - o I am an individual member of the NRA
 - o I make this declaration as a participant in an NRA Guest Day
 - o I hold a Firearm Certificate or GB Visitor's Firearm Permit permitting me to use, for target shooting, the firearms that I shall fire in this event
 - o I am a member of a Club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI and will be shooting as a member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 as amended
- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')

Eligibility

- On the first day of the Event I will be aged fourteen years or over; OR I have the written approval of the NRA and
 the Event director to participate notwithstanding my age.
- I certify that I am qualified to participate in accordance with the Regulations and hold a current certificate of Safety and Competence, which I will present at the Event
- I am an individual member of the NRA; or by virtue of at least one of the following I meet the criteria to be granted,
 and I apply for, temporary membership of the NRA for the duration of the Event:
 - o I hold a UK Firearm Certificate, GB Visitor's Firearm Permit or Permit under S7 Firearms Act 1968 authorising possession of a full-bore rifle, small-bore rifle or muzzle-loading pistol
 - o I am a full member of a club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI
 - o I am a present member of HM Forces and have current military certification of competence with a full-bore rifle

Warnings:

- I agree that I have been warned that ear protection must and eye protection may be required to be worn at all
 times in the vicinity of all firing points while shooting is in progress, and shall not hold the organiser responsible for
 any injury resulting from non-compliance therewith. Any mandatory details will be contained within the specific
 Event Notes for each Event
- I agree to abide by the rules of the National Rifle Association and of the Event and I will accept the decisions of the
 Event Director or the NRA as final
- I agree that results of a Competition and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere containing my name, competitor number, class and score
- I understand that if I have debts to NRA or NSC Ltd over 90 days outstanding, squadding cards will not be issued to me until these have been settled in full
