

Smallbore Long Range Match Competition Notes

Sunday 24th March 2024

- Programme: 13:30-16:30: Century Range 200 and 300 yards
- Entry Fee: One Class: £38.00, Two Classes: £68.00
- Under 25 Discount: 40% discount off entry fee for those that are under 25 years old on the day of the Event
- Meeting Membership: £10.50
- Entry Deadline: Monday 18th March at midday
- **Cancellations:** Cancellations must be received via email to <u>competitions@nra.org.uk</u> by 8am Thursday 21st March. Entries will be fully refunded (or credited) before this time, after this point entries are non-refundable. Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of cancellation
- Entry Requirement Summary (See Terms of Entry below for full details):
 - ✓ Shooter Certification Card (SCC): Each civilian shooting on a MoD or NRA range has to carry a SCC issued by the chairman of a club of which they are a member and which is affiliated to the NRA. Competitors MUST be in possession of their SCC when shooting on NRA ranges. If you do not have an SCC for the type of firearm you wish to participate with please contact the Competition Co-ordinator before entering
 - ✓ This competition is open to members of Home Office Approved Clubs (HOAC) who are not prohibited under section 21 of the Firearms Act (The NRA is the largest HOAC in the UK)
 - ✓ Non-NRA members are welcome, but are required to pay the Meeting Member Fee
 - ✓ On the first day of the Competition you must be aged 14 or over (please contact the Competition Coordinator before entering if this is not the case)
- **Making an entry:** Entries can be made and paid for online via: <u>online.nra.org.uk</u>. A downloadable paper entry form will also be available which can be returned via email or post.
- **Firearms/Classes:** Any single shot rifle chambered for .22 Long Rifle, Long or Short Rimfire ammunition may be used. A sling may be used. Bolt-action magazine fed firearms are permitted, semi-auto magazine fed firearms are not permitted. Competitors can compete in the following classes:
 - **F Class Smallbore (FCSB):** Iron, magnifying or telescopic sights may be fitted. The forend of the rifle may be placed on a rest or bipod, and the butt may be rested on a sandbag
 - **Match Rifle Smallbore (MRSB):** Iron, magnifying or telescopic sights may be fitted. The forward hand may also be rested, but the rifle itself may not touch the rest and the butt may not be rested or touch the ground
 - Target Rifle Smallbore (TRSB): Iron sights only, the forward hand may not be rested
 - Service Rifle Smallbore (SRSB): British or foreign military training rifles such as the Enfield No 2, 8 or 9, foreign equivalents or Morris tube conversions. Iron sights of any type, the forward hand may not be rested
- **Muzzle Energy:** Ranges at Bisley use the Danger Area of Pirbright Range, which under MoD requirements state that all firearms used must either have a muzzle energy under 4,500 Joules (3,319 ft lbs), or else be zeroed at 200 yards or on the Bisley Zero Range prior to being used at a longer distance. If your ME exceeds the limit then you must zero your rifle, using the specially designed target, the day before the start of your particular Meeting
- **Competitions:** The Match consists of 2 squadded competitions and 1 aggregate competition: 200 yards, 300 yards, and the 200 & 300 yard Aggregate

- Number of Shots: Blow-off shots (see below), up to 3 practice shots, 2 convertible sighting shots and 15 shots to count at each distance
- **Blow-Off Shots:** A period of one minute during which blow-off (warming) shots may be fired at the stop butt will be allowed before shooting for score commences at 200 and 300 yards
- Timing of Shots: The time allowed for each shot will be 45 seconds (NRA rule 351)
- Targets: 200 yards: NRA/HBSA Round Bull (V Bull 3.5, Bull 5, Inner 12, Magpie 24, Outer 35 inch diameter) 300 yards: NRA/HBSA Round Bull (V Bull 5, Bull 7.5, Inner 18, Magpie 30, Outer 35 inch diameter)
- Marking/ Scoring: Markers will be provided. Standard NRA scoring will be used
- String Shooting: Please not that string shooting is not permitted
- Ammunition: Competitors are to supply their own ammunition
- **Firing Position:** Prone or Supine. A competitor who is unable to shoot prone may apply upon entry to shoot from a bench. **Competitors must provide their own bench.** The weight of the rifle must be borne fully by the body. The butt may be supported in the shoulder but must not rest on the table or on an artificial support of any kind. The competitor, table and other equipment together, must not take up more than their allotted space on the firing point. The table must be of conventional design and be capable of being moved and erected by the competitor
- **Squadding:** You will be 'squadded' 3 competitors per target into either Detail 1 or 2 (or both of you are competing in two Classes). Once entries to the event have closed you will be emailed a copy of the squadding.
 - If you are new to the Smallbore Long Range Match and wish to be squadded alongside a specific competitor, please add a note to this effect on your entry form and we will try to arrange this
- **On the Day:** Please head straight to the range to collect your scorecards and for the 13.15 hrs Range Safety briefing. Shooter Certification Cards (SCCs) will be checked if not held on Shooting Division records
- **Results:** Results will be typed up and published on the day, and will be available online: <u>www.nra.org.uk/liveresults</u>
- **Challenging Results:** It is the competitor's responsibility on the day of the competition to ensure that they have taken their scores down correctly before submitting their scorecard. Any challenges of this nature must be made immediately on the day. Following the publishing of scores online competitors have until midday on the Thursday 29th March to contact the NRA for errors relating to the digitising of the hand recorded scores. - Awards: NRA Medals and awards are awarded in each class, in each of the 200x, 300x and 200/300x Aggregate competitions subject to Prize List D of the NRA handbook:
 - o 2+ Entries: Gold Medal
 - o 6+ Entries: Gold and Silver Medal
 - o 11+ Entries: Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal
- Prizegiving: Prizegiving will take place at the 300 yards Firing Point following the completion of the Match
- **Firearms Usage:** The NRA is required to keep a record of firearms used by competitors as required by the Firearms (Amendment) Acts 1997. Following a Competition please go to your online profile and update your firearms usage: <u>online.nra.org.uk/customer/firearmusages</u>

Terms of Entry:

- I agree I meet the entry criteria as stated in these Event Notes
- I confirm that the information given on the attached Entry form is true, complete and accurate

Access to firearms:

- I meet at least one of the following conditions that legitimises my access to firearms:
 - o I am an individual member of the NRA
 - o I make this declaration as a participant in an NRA Guest Day
 - I hold a Firearm Certificate or GB Visitor's Firearm Permit permitting me to use, for target shooting, the firearms that I shall fire in this event
 - I am a member of a Club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI and will be shooting as a member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 as amended
- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')

Eligibility

- On the first day of the Event I will be aged fourteen years or over; OR I have the written approval of the NRA and the Event director to participate notwithstanding my age.
- I certify that I am qualified to participate in accordance with the Regulations and hold a current certificate of Safety and Competence, which I will present at the Event
- I am an individual member of the NRA; or by virtue of at least one of the following I meet the criteria to be granted, and I apply for, temporary membership of the NRA for the duration of the Event:
 - o I hold a UK Firearm Certificate, GB Visitor's Firearm Permit or Permit under S7 Firearms Act 1968 authorising possession of a full-bore rifle, small-bore rifle or muzzle-loading pistol
 - o I am a full member of a club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI
 - o I am a present member of HM Forces and have current military certification of competence with a full-bore rifle

Warnings:

- I agree that I have been warned that ear protection must and eye protection may be required to be worn at all times in the vicinity of all firing points while shooting is in progress, and shall not hold the organiser responsible for any injury resulting from non-compliance therewith. Any mandatory details will be contained within the specific Event Notes for each Event
- I agree to abide by the rules of the National Rifle Association and of the Event and I will accept the decisions of the Event Director or the NRA as final
- I agree that results of a Competition and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere containing my name, competitor number, class and score
- I understand that if I have debts to NRA or NSC Ltd over 90 days outstanding, squadding cards will not be issued to me until these have been settled in full
