- o Saturday: Timed & Precision 1, Multi-Target, NRA Embassy Cup, Service Match
- **Sunday:** Practical Shotgun Match (*half-day competition, part of the NRA Shotgun League*)

• Entry Fees:

- o Saturday 30 minute matches: £14.00
- o Saturday 45 minute matches: £15.25
- Sunday Practical Match (half day): £38.00
- Under 25 Discount: 40% discount off entry fee for those that are under 25 years old on the day of the Event
- Multiple Entry Discount: 10% discount when entering 4 or more competitions over the whole weekend
- Meeting Membership: £10.50
- Entry Deadline: Monday 4th March at midday
- **Cancellations:** Cancellations must be received via email to <u>competitions@nra.org.uk</u> by 8am Thursday 7th March. Entries will be fully refunded (or credited) before this time, after this point entries are non-refundable. Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of cancellation

General TS Festival Event Information:

- Entry Requirement Summary (See Terms of Entry below for full details):
 - ✓ Shooter Certification Card (SCC): Each civilian shooting on a MoD or NRA range has to carry a SCC issued by the chairman of a club of which they are a member and which is affiliated to the NRA. Competitors MUST be in possession of their SCC when shooting on NRA ranges. If you do not have an SCC for the type of firearm you wish to participate with please contact the Competition Co-ordinator before entering
 - ✓ This competition is open to members of Home Office Approved Clubs (HOAC) who are not prohibited under section 21 of the Firearms Act (The NRA is the largest HOAC in the UK). Non-NRA members are welcome, but are required to pay the Meeting Member Fee
 - ✓ On the first day of the Competition you must be aged 14 or over (please contact the Competition Coordinator before entering if this is not the case)
- **Making an entry:** Entries can be made and paid for online via: <u>online.nra.org.uk</u>. A downloadable paper entry form will also be available which can be returned via email or post
 - o Competitors can only compete in each event once per firearm class there are no reshoots available
- **Gallery Rifle ID (GRID):** This is a unique index number that allows us to match up your scores from multiple events in TS Festivals, and is also used for the Cottesloe Heath Challenge and Action Weekend Competitions. Your GRID is listed on your membership profile and on our online booking website: <u>online.nra.org.uk/customer/info</u>
- Saturday Competition Classes:
 - Any Shotgun (SG): Any Shotgun
 - **Manual (SGM):** Any Manual Action Shotgun with an integral tubular magazine or detachable magazine
 - Semi-Automatic (SGSA): Any Semi-Automatic Shotgun with an integral tubular magazine or detachable magazine
 - **Classic (SGC):** Any shotgun that is not magazine fed and is not fitted with optical or electronic (red dot, telescopic etc.) sights
- Sunday Competition Classes:
 - **Standard:** Any Semi-Auto Action Shotgun with a fixed magazine, iron sights only
 - Standard Manual: Any Manual Action Shotgun with a fixed magazine, iron sights only
 - o **Open:** Any Shotgun

- **Courses of Fire:** Saturday competitions are listed in the TS Handbook which can be found <u>online</u> and in a FREE paperback book available from NRA Reception. The design of the Practical course is not published in advance of the event, see below for ammunition advice
- **Firing Positions:** Para A3.4 of the TS Handbook: When entering a Meeting, a competitor who has a physical disability (temporary or permanent) which prevents the use of a position specified in the event conditions may apply to the Meeting Director for permission to use an alternative position. Such an application should be supported by medical evidence (e.g. a Doctor's note) whenever possible. The Meeting Director will determine which, if any alternative position(s) the competitor will be allowed to use in which event(s) and will notify the competitor of the decision. The competitor will typically be allowed to adopt the next most difficult position applicable to the event. This will vary between events but may include:
 - o a. Sitting instead of Prone
 - o b. Kneeling instead of Sitting
 - o c. Standing (strong or weak shoulder/hand) instead of Kneeling, Sitting or Prone
 - o d. Kneeling Unsupported instead of Standing
- Ammunition: Fibre wad ammunition only (Plastic wads that remain fixed to solid slugs during flight are permitted)
 - The course of fire for the Practical Match varies at each Meeting. We advise bringing 75-100 rounds of Birdshot (size UK 4/5/6/7/8), NO Buckshot, and 26-35 rounds of Slug ammunition to account for misses and re-shoots
- **Muzzle Energy:** Ranges at Bisley use the Danger Area of Pirbright Range, which under MoD requirements state that all firearms used must either have a muzzle energy under 4,500 Joules (3,319 ft lbs), or else be zeroed at 200 yards or on the Bisley Zero Range prior to being used at a longer distance. If your ME exceeds the limit then you must zero your rifle, using the specially designed target, the day before the start of your particular Meeting
- **Squadding:** Once entries have closed your competitions will be allocated (squadded) to a specific time slot during the day which will be communicated to you via email. Please ensure you arrive to the range approximately 15 minutes before the competition starts
 - If you are new to TS and wish to be squadded alongside another competitor, please add a note to this effect on your entry form and we will try to arrange this
- **On the Day:** Please head straight to the range, and collect your scorecard pack from a member of the Range Team do not go to NRA Reception
 - Competitions on Saturday have individual scorecards you will need to complete. The 'Stats copy' side needs to be posted into the scorecard box on range once it has been signed and checked by the Range Officer. You may keep the 'Competitor copy' half for your own records
 - On Sunday, scores are input directly onto an electronic tablet, and there are no scorecards to collect
- **Results:** Results will be typed up on the next working day following the Competition and will be available online: <u>www.nra.org.uk/liveresults</u>
- **Challenging Results:** It is the competitor's responsibility on the day of the competition to ensure that scores are written down correctly, before being signed by the Range Officer and posted in the scorecard box. For the Practical match competitors must check the tablet input before it is submitted. Any challenges of this nature must be made immediately on the day. Following the publishing of scores online competitors have until midday on the Thursday of the same week to contact the NRA for errors relating to the digitising of the hand recorded scores. - **Firearms Usage:** The NRA is required to keep a record of firearms used by competitors as required by the Firearms (Amendment) Acts 1997. Following a Competition please go to your online profile and update your firearms usage: <u>online.nra.org.uk/customer/firearmusages</u>
- Awards (Saturday): NRA medals are presented to the winners of each competition. These are engraved after the meeting, and will available to collect from the Phoenix Meeting, or posted out if not collected. Medals are awarded in each event, in each class to the highest scoring competitors, the amount of medals awarded is subject to Prize List D of the NRA handbook:
 - o 2+ Scorecards: Gold Medal
 - o 6+ Scorecards: Gold and Silver Medal
 - 11+ Scorecards: Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal

- Awards (Sunday): Scores made in the Practical Matches go towards the 2024 NRA League standings. Awards will be presented in Spring 2024 upon completion of the League
- Prizegiving: There is no Prizegiving at this Competition, medals will be distributed after the event

Terms of Entry:

- I agree I meet the entry criteria as stated in these Event Notes
- I confirm that the information given on the attached Entry form is true, complete and accurate

Access to firearms:

- I meet at least one of the following conditions that legitimise my access to firearms:
 - I am an individual member of the NRA
 - I make this declaration as a participant in an NRA Guest Day
 - I hold a Firearm Certificate or GB Visitor's Firearm Permit permitting me to use, for target shooting, the firearms that I shall fire in this event
 - I am a member of a Club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI and will be shooting as a member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 as amended
- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')

Eligibility

- On the first day of the Event I will be aged fourteen years or over; OR I have the written approval of the NRA and the Event director to participate notwithstanding my age.
- I certify that I am qualified to participate in accordance with the Regulations and hold a current certificate of Safety and Competence, which I will present at the Event
- I am an individual member of the NRA; or by virtue of at least one of the following I meet the criteria to be granted, and I apply for, temporary membership of the NRA for the duration of the Event:
 - I hold a UK Firearm Certificate, GB Visitor's Firearm Permit or Permit under S7 Firearms Act 1968 authorising possession of a full-bore rifle, small-bore rifle or muzzle-loading pistol
 - o I am a full member of a club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI
 - o I am a present member of HM Forces and have current military certification of competence with a full-bore rifle

Warnings:

- I agree that I have been warned that ear protection must and eye protection may be required to be worn at all times in the vicinity of all firing points while shooting is in progress, and shall not hold the organiser responsible for any injury resulting from non-compliance therewith. Any mandatory details will be contained within the specific Event Notes for each Event
- I agree to abide by the rules of the National Rifle Association and of the Event and I will accept the decisions of the Event Director or the NRA as final
- I agree that results of a Competition and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere containing my name, competitor number, class and score
- I understand that if I have debts to NRA or NSC Ltd over 90 days outstanding, squadding cards will not be issued to me until these have been settled in full
