Club Team Match (Concurrent) £11.00 per team: Teams of 5 shooters, highest 4 scores in each **Timed & Precision 1** and **Multi-Target** to count. Team members must be from the same Rifle Club, and must enter the individual competitions, which can be shot at any time during the Meeting. Team Nominations containing the names and GRIDs of Team members must be submitted to the Competitions Team by **8am Thursday 23rd May**

- 4 separate prizelists for: GRSB, GRCF, LBP & LBR firearms; competitors can only represent one team in each class
- Scores from LBP / LBR iron sights and GRCF Classic events will qualify if 'standard' T&P1 and M-T events have not been entered

Sporting Statics (Concurrent) £8.50 per team: Teams of 4 shooters, highest scores in **Sporting Rifle Statics (5685)** to count. Team members can be from different Rifle Clubs, and must enter the individual competitions, which can only be shot Saturday 24th May. Team Nominations containing the names and GRIDs of Team members must be submitted to the Competitions Team by **8am Thursday 23rd May**. Competitors can only represent one team in this event

- 🏆 The International Sporting Rifle Trophy will be presented to the highest scoring team

Discounts: Off Individual entry fees only, discounts are only applicable to entries made before the Entry Deadline

- **10% Off Entry Fees** when you enter 6 or more competitions
- **15% Off Entry Fees** when you enter 12 or more competitions
- **20% Off Entry Fees** when you enter 20 or more competitions
- **40% Off Entry Fees** for those that are under 25 years old on the last day of the Event

Entry Deadline: Monday 19th May at midday

- Entries will be accepted during the Meeting, and are subject to range availability. Any entries made during the Meeting will be stamped. Stamped scorecards do not benefit from advanced squadding, but can be fully refunded if unused and returned to NRA Reception by the end of the Meeting

Cancellations: Cancellations must be received via email to competitions@nra.org.uk by **8am Tuesday 20th May**. Entries will be fully refunded (or credited) before this time, after this point entries are non-refundable. Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of cancellation.

If you are been unable to shoot an events due to an event management issue (such as targetry failure), you can request a Refund/Credit form at the main NRA reception during the Meeting. The requisite scorecards must be included with the form, and if approved you will be notified via email

Entry Requirements:

- ✓ **Shooter Certification Card (SCC):** All shooters MUST be in possession of their SCC when shooting on NRA ranges. This is awarded to NRA Members, or by a Club Chairperson (of NRA affiliated Clubs) once a shooter has satisfied criteria as to the shooter's ability to use firearms and ammunition safely. If not in possession of an SCC, shooters may apply for a temporary SCC by emailing competitions@nra.org.uk
- ✓ **NRA Membership:** Membership to the NRA is required to shoot on NSC Ranges, and ensures the individual is covered by the NRA insurance package. Non-NRA members are welcome, but are required to pay an additional Non-Member Fee
- ✓ On the first day of the event you must be aged 14 or over (please contact the event Co-ordinator before entering if this is not the case)

Making an entry: Entries can be made and paid for online via: online.nra.org.uk. A downloadable paper entry form will also be available which can be returned via email or post

Gallery Rifle ID (GRID): This is a unique index number that allows us to match up your scores from multiple Action Weekend Competitions. Your GRID is listed on your membership profile and on our online booking website: online.nra.org.uk/customer/info. If not yet in possession of one, this will be issued when you make your entry

Alternative Shooting Position: When entering a Meeting, a competitor who has a physical disability (temporary or permanent) which prevents the use of a position specified in the event conditions can apply to the Meeting Director for permission to use an alternative position (see paragraph A3.5 of the GR&P Handbook). If approved the competitor will be issued an Alternative Position certificate to show to the Range Office, detailing the next most difficult position to use

Re-Shoot Events: You may only enter each specific event once – i.e. once per firearm type. The exceptions to this are the Speed Steels, Mini McQueen and McQueen events that allow unlimited re-shoots over the Weekend. Re-shoot tickets can be purchased as part of your online entry, or from the NRA Reception on the Weekend. The tickets may be used for all Action Weekend events in 2025 (i.e. Spring, Phoenix, GR&P Nationals and the Autumn Action).

Courses of Fire: Conditions and courses of fire are listed in the Gallery Rifle & Pistol Handbook which can be found online via: nra.org.uk/all-downloads/nra-handbooks and in a FREE paperback book available from NRA Reception

Firearms: Please refer to the match condition as to which firearm types can contest each match. The specification of each firearm type can be found in the front of the Gallery Rifle & Pistol Handbook

Muzzle Energy: Ranges at Bisley use the Danger Area of Pirbright Range, which under MoD requirements state that all firearms used must either have a muzzle energy under 4,500 Joules (3,319 ft lbs), or else be zeroed at 200 yards or on the Bisley Zero Range prior to being used at a longer distance. If your ME exceeds the limit then you must zero your rifle, using the specially designed target, the day before the start of your particular Meeting

Speed Steel Ammunition: Magnum, armour piercing, high velocity, jacketed or plated rounds are not permitted on steel plate targets

Dress: Dress for shooting should be appropriate to the discipline and weather. A firer whose dress, equipment or position is thought inappropriate or likely to bring the Association into disrepute may be challenged by the MD/CRO/RO or a member of NRA Staff and may be required to withdraw from an event. The wearing of a single item of military pattern surplus clothing is not likely to warrant action by the Range or NRA Staff

- **Eye protection:** is mandatory when on or near the firing point on GR&P and Shotgun Ranges (e.g. Cheylesmore, Butt Zero, Melville, Running Deer, Short Siberia, Time Limit, Winans)
- **Ear protection:** All competitors MUST wear ear protection when near or on the firing point of all ranges

Squadding: All entries made prior to the deadline will be allocated (squadded) to a specific time slots during the weekend which will be communicated to you via email. Squadding is subject to change right up until the collection of your scorecards, so please follow your squadding link for details of any updates.

- **Special Squadding requests:** You will be squadded randomly, with the exception of those supervising junior shooters, or those sharing firearms. If you wish to request 'special squadding' please add a comment when entering
- **"Unsquadded" events:** Any entries made during the Meetings will be unsquadded. Entries made before the deadline may also contain events listed without a time slot, this indicates there is no availability to squad them at the present time. These events are fully refundable once the unused scorecards have been returned to the NRA reception by the end of the Meeting. Competitors are responsible for speaking to Range Officers to fit into any gaps on range. The NRA team can assist in advising when there may be on the range availability

Range Volunteers: In order to run our calendar of events we rely on enthusiastic members of the shooting community to assist in running NRA Competitions. Each Range requires a qualified RSO/RCO, but the majority of the team do not require a qualification and provide support with scoring, re-facing targets, checking clear rifles, working the control box, organising the next details

When you arrive: Report to NRA Reception to collect your Competitor Pack. All competitions (except for the Practical Pistol Match) have individual scorecards you will need to complete. The 'Stats copy' side needs to be posted into the scorecard box on range once it has been signed and checked by the Range Officer. You may keep the 'Competitor copy' half for your own records

Scorecards: Please attach one of the personalised labels with your name and GRID number on to the Stats Copy side of each of your scorecards

Results: Results will be input on the day of the Competition and will be available online: www.nra.org.uk/liveresults

Challenging Results: It is the competitor's responsibility on the day of the competition to ensure that scores are written down correctly before being signed by the Range Officer and posted in the scorecard box. Any challenges to scores before they are signed off must be made immediately to the Range Team on the day

- During the Meeting a 'BX' board of scorecards that cannot be processed will be displayed on the scorecard boards to the side of the Main NRA Building, and also online. Competitors may go to the Stats Office during the Meeting to request an update to the error on the card by the Chief of Stats
- Once the Meeting has finished no edits can be made for competitor errors on the scorecards. Following the publishing of scores online competitors have until midday on the Thursday of the following week to contact the NRA for errors relating to the digitising of the hand recorded scores. Please email competitions@nra.org.uk with any challenges

Awards: NRA Medals and awards are presented to the top scoring competitors in each match, subject to the amount of entries. Certain matches have 'Classifications' meaning that competitors will be grouped with those of the same Class based on previous performances (see GR&P Handbook section B12). For all Classified events medals will be presented in each class subject to the same boundaries:

- 2+ Entries: Gold Medal
- 6+ Entries: Gold and Silver Medal
- 11+ Entries: Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal

Alan Whittle Novice Trophy: This will be awarded to the competitor who has not previously entered an open Meeting at Bisley or elsewhere, who achieves the highest number of points in the standard medal scores system. See the GR&P Handbook (and below) for details

Standard Scores: Gold, Silver and Bronze Standard Scores are set for most events at the Phoenix Meeting – see section D of the GR&P Handbook for more details. If you achieve this score, a G, S or B will be displayed next to your score on the result list. Please note this does not mean you are entitled to a Gold, Silver or Bronze Medal. Standards accumulate points towards a Grand Master medal – see below:

Grand Master Medal: A competitor will be awarded a Grand Master medal on accumulating a minimum of 20 points from Standard Scores. Grand Master medals will be posted out to competitors after the Meeting:

- Gold Standard: 5 points
- Silver Standard: 3 points
- Bronze Standard: 1 point

Prizegiving: Will take place on Sunday 25th May at 6pm in the NRA Pavilion. All individual Gold medals and trophies will be presented. Once the results are finalised the silver and bronze medals will be sent for engraving, and made ready to collect at the Gallery Rifle Nationals. If they are not collected by the Gallery Rifle Nationals they will be posted out to competitors

Phoenix BBQ 2025: Saturday 24th May: We are delighted to extend an invite to all competitors, spectators and ROs to the Phoenix BBQ which will be hosted at the Canadian Pavilion. Doors will open from 6pm with BBQ buffet served from 6.30pm. The Canadian Pavilion boasts a number of recent refurbishments, including to the bar and function space, whilst still maintaining its fantastic history. Menu & Ticket price to be confirmed, but will be available once competition entries open in April.

Firearms Usage: The NRA is required to keep a record of firearms used by competitors as required by the Firearms (Amendment) Acts 1997. Following a Competition please go to your online profile and update your firearms usage: online.nra.org.uk/customer/firearmusages

Terms of Entry:

- I agree I meet the entry criteria as stated in these Event Notes
- I confirm that the information given on the attached Entry Form is true, complete and accurate

Access to firearms:

- I meet at least one of the following conditions that legitimise my access to firearms:
 - I am an individual member of the NRA
 - I make this declaration as a participant in an NRA Guest Day
 - I hold a Firearm Certificate or GB Visitor's Firearm Permit permitting me to use, for target shooting, the firearms that I shall fire in this event
 - I am a member of a Club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI and will be shooting as a member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 as amended
- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')

Eligibility

- On the first day of the Event I will be aged fourteen years or over; OR I have the written approval of the NRA and the Event director to participate notwithstanding my age.
- I certify that I am qualified to participate in accordance with the Regulations and hold a current certificate of Safety and Competence, which I will present at the Event
- I am an individual member of the NRA; or by virtue of at least one of the following I meet the criteria to be granted, and I apply for, temporary membership of the NRA for the duration of the Event:
 - I hold a UK Firearm Certificate, GB Visitor's Firearm Permit or Permit under S7 Firearms Act 1968 authorising possession of a full-bore rifle, small-bore rifle or muzzle-loading pistol
 - I am a full member of a club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI
 - I am a present member of HM Forces and have current military certification of competence with a full-bore rifle

Warnings:

- I agree that I have been warned that ear protection must and eye protection may be required to be worn at all times in the vicinity of all firing points while shooting is in progress, and shall not hold the organiser responsible for any injury resulting from non-compliance therewith. Any mandatory details will be contained within the specific Event Notes for each Event
- I agree to abide by the rules of the National Rifle Association and of the Event and I will accept the decisions of the Event Director or the NRA as final
- I agree that results of a Competition and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere containing my name, competitor number, class and score
- I understand that if I have debts to NRA or NSC Ltd over 90 days outstanding, squadding cards will not be issued to me until these have been settled in full
