Entry into the CSR Championship is automatic upon entering all Thursday, Friday and Saturday individual Matches

Under 25 Discount: 40% discount off entry fee for those that are under 25 years old on the day of the Event

Non-Member Fee: £16.00

Entry Deadline: Monday 23rd June at midday

Payment: All entries must be paid at point of entry. Overseas competitors may pay when collecting scorecards due to overseas transactions fees. Clubs and Schools can be invoiced by sending us a list of competitor names to competitions@nra.org.uk

Cancellations: Cancellations must be received via email to squadding@nra.org.uk by **8am two working days prior to each competition**. i.e. if you wish to cancel your entry to the Rural Match on Saturday 5th July, you must send a cancellation via email before 8 am Thursday 3rd July. Entries cancelled in time will be fully refunded (or credited), after this point entries are non-refundable. Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of cancellation. Any uncompleted aggregates will also be refunded/ credited as per this policy

Entry Requirement Summary (See Terms of Entry below for full details):

- ✓ **Shooter Certification Card (SCC):** All shooters MUST be in possession of their SCC when shooting on NRA ranges. This is awarded to NRA Members, or by a Club Chairperson (of NRA affiliated Clubs) once a shooter has satisfied criteria as to the shooter's ability to use firearms and ammunition safely. If not in possession of an SCC, shooters may apply for a temporary SCC by emailing competitions@nra.org.uk
- ✓ **NRA Membership:** Membership to the NRA is required to shoot on NSC Ranges, and ensures the individual is covered by the NRA insurance package. Non-NRA members are welcome, but are required to pay an additional Non-Member Fee
- ✓ On the first day of the event you must be aged 14 or over (please contact the event Co-ordinator before entering if this is not the case)

Making an entry: Entries can be made and paid for online via: online.nra.org.uk. A downloadable paper entry form will also be available which can be returned via email or post

Gallery Rifle ID (GRID): This is a unique index number that allows us to match up your scores from the CSR Imperial and other events including the CSR Winter League and Action Weekends. Your GRID is listed on your membership profile and on our online booking website: online.nra.org.uk/customer/info

Overseas Competitors: Applications for Visitors Firearms Permits should be made at your earliest opportunity, as it can take a minimum of 3 months to be processed. Please use the Visitors Firearms Permit application form available as a download on the NRA website. Competitors from within the European Community must include a valid European Firearms Pass where applicable

Classes:

- Historic Enfield: Any SMLE/ No.4/ No. 5 rifle, service pattern as issued, with no attachments
- Any Iron: Any rifle with iron sights, with no restriction on slings (but rests may not be used)
- Service Optic: Any rifle with optic sights, max 4.5 magnification with no restriction on slings. Rests may not be used. (Any vertical or angled fore grip, if fitted, may be used)
- Practical Optic: Any rifle with optic sights, with no restriction on slings or rests. Bipods must remain in the folded or retracted state at the start of a stage and may only be deployed when on the firing point and moving into the final firing position. A bipod must remain fitted to the firearm for the duration of the Stage or Practice

Muzzle Energy: Ranges at Bisley use the Danger Area of Pirbright Range, which under MoD requirements state that all firearms used must either have a muzzle energy under 4,500 Joules (3,319 ft lbs), or else be zeroed at 200 yards or on the Bisley Zero Range prior to being used at a longer distance. If your ME exceeds the limit then you must zero your rifle, using the specially designed target, the day before the start of your particular Meeting

Classifications: Each match in the Imperial Programme has its own Classification boundaries (see CSR Handbook). Within each firearm class shooters will be divided into classification groups based on the highest score they achieved in the three years prior to the current Meeting. New shooters to the CSR Imperial will be placed in the lowest class

Courses of Fire: Conditions and courses of fire are listed in the CSR Handbook which can be found [online](#) and in a FREE paperback book available from NRA Reception

Firing Positions: Prone, sitting, kneeling and standing. Para A3.2.22 of the CSR Handbook: A firer who has a physical disability (temporary or permanent) which prevents the use of a position specified in the match conditions may assume the next most difficult position instead. The CRO, RO and the MD must be informed before the start of the match. The following substitutions are among those permitted:

- The sitting position instead of the prone position
- The kneeling position instead of the sitting position
- The standing position instead of the kneeling position
- The kneeling unsupported position (either on two knees or on one knee without resting the elbow on the knee) instead of the standing position

Squadding: Once entries have closed, everyone will be 'squadded' for each match into a specific group that will rotate between firing the competitions and operating Targetry in the Butts – **please note that marking for your fellow competitors is a term of entry**. If you are physically unable to operate targets, there will be additional competitors available to assist. Once entries to the event have closed, you will be emailed a copy of the squadding

Special Squadding Requests: You will be squadded randomly, with the exception of those supervising junior shooters, those new to CSR, or those sharing firearms. If you wish to request special squadding please make a note on your entry

Results: Results will be input on the day of the Competition and will be available online: www.nra.org.uk/liveresults

Challenging Results: It is the competitor's responsibility on the day of the competition to ensure that the Wing Officer records their scores correctly. Any challenges of this nature must be made immediately on the day. Following the publishing of scores online competitors have until midday the following day to contact the NRA for errors relating to the digitising of the hand-recorded scores. Please email competitions@nra.org.uk with any challenges

Firearms Usage: The NRA is required to keep a record of firearms used by competitors as required by the Firearms (Amendment) Acts 1997. Following a Competition please go to your online profile and update your firearms usage: online.nra.org.uk/customer/firearmusages

Awards: NRA Medals are awarded to each Competition, in each firearm class, for each classification group, subject to Prize List D of the NRA handbook:

- 2+ Entries: Gold Medal
- 6+ Entries: Gold and Silver Medal
- 11+ Entries: Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal

Additional Prizes are awarded, care of our sponsors Aim Field Sports, Vortex Optics & G-TEN. for the Rural, Urban match & Falling Plates see the NRA Handbook for full details

Prizegiving: Prizegiving (and annual BBQ) will take place on Saturday 5th July at the **Canadian Pavilion**, following the completion of the Individual CSR Imperial Competitions. Prizegiving will start with the presentation of CSR Winter League awards for the 2024/25 season

BBQ: If you wish to join your fellow shooters for a BBQ buffet, you must pre-purchase a BBQ ticket, which is available when you book your competition entry

- I am a member of a Club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI and will be shooting as a member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')

Warnings:

- I agree to abide by the rules of the National Rifle Association and I will accept the decisions of the Event Director or the NRA as final
- I agree that results of the Competition and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere containing my name, competitor number, country, class and score
- I agree that I have read the NSC Range Regulations in regards to the wearing of ear protection, and Appendix III of the NRA Handbook in regards to the wearing of eye protection, and shall not hold the organiser responsible for any injury resulting from non-compliance therewith. Any mandatory details will be contained within these Event Notes
