Discounts: Off entry fees only. Multi-competition discounts are only applicable to entries made before the deadline

The Trafalgar dinner: £35 per person. Relax with your fellow shooters and ROs after a busy day of shooting. Hosted at the Canadian Pavilion, the evening will run from 7-10:30pm, to include a 3 course meal followed by a port toast to the memory of Admiral Lord Nelson

Entry Deadline: Monday 13th October at midday

Entries will be accepted during the Meeting, and are subject to range availability. Any entries made during the Meeting will be stamped. Stamped scorecards do not benefit from advanced squadding, but can be fully refunded if unused and returned to NRA Reception by the end of the Meeting

Cancellations: Cancellations must be received via email to competitions@nra.org.uk by 8am Thursday 16th October. Entries will be fully refunded (or credited) before this time, after this point entries are non-refundable. Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of cancellation

Entry Requirement Summary (See Terms of Entry below for full details):

- ✓ **Shooter Certification Card (SCC):** All shooters MUST be in possession of their SCC when shooting on NRA ranges. This is awarded to NRA Members, or by a Club Chairperson (of NRA affiliated Clubs) once a shooter has satisfied criteria as to the shooter's ability to use firearms and ammunition safely. If not in possession of an SCC, shooters may apply for a temporary SCC by emailing competitions@nra.org.uk
- ✓ **NRA Membership:** Membership to the NRA is required to shoot on NSC Ranges, and ensures the individual is covered by the NRA insurance package. Non-NRA members are welcome, but are required to pay an additional Non-Member Fee
- ✓ On the first day of the event you must be aged 14 or over (please contact the event Co-ordinator before entering if this is not the case)

Making an entry: Entries can be made and paid for online via: <u>online.nra.org.uk</u>. A downloadable paper entry form will also be available which can be returned via email or post

Gallery Rifle ID (GRID): This is a unique index number that allows us to match up your scores from multiple NRA Competitions. Your GRID is listed on your membership profile and on our online booking website: online.nra.org.uk/customer/info. If not yet in possession of one, this will be issued when you make your entry

Alternative Shooting Position: When entering a Meeting, a competitor who has a physical disability (temporary or permanent) which prevents the use of a position specified in the event conditions can apply via the entry form to the Meeting Director for permission to use an alternative position. Subject to approval the competitor will normally be allowed to adopt the next most difficult position for the event

Different Firearms: Competitors are not permitted to enter a match more than once, unless it is with a different firearm. If you have more than one firearm that is eligible for the same event, you may make multiple entries for that event – if so please state this clearly on your entry

Re-Shoot Events: You may only enter each specific event once – i.e. once per firearm type. The exceptions to this are the Running Boar, Running Deer and McQueen events that allow unlimited re-shoots during the Meeting

o Re-shoot tickets can be purchased as part of your online entry, or from the NRA Reception during the Meeting. Any un-used tickets can be refunded if returned to NRA Reception by the end of the Meeting

Overseas Competitors: Applications for Visitors Firearms Permits should be made at your earliest opportunity, as it can take a minimum of 3 months to be processed. Please use the Visitors Firearms Permit application form available as a download on the NRA website. Competitors from within the European Community must include a valid European Firearms Pass where applicable

Courses of Fire: Conditions and courses of fire are listed in the Classic & Historic Handbook which can be found <u>online</u> and in a FREE paperback book available from NRA Reception

Firearms: Please refer to the match condition as to which firearm types can contest each match

Muzzle Energy: Ranges at Bisley use the Danger Area of Pirbright Range, which under MoD requirements state that all firearms used must either have a muzzle energy under 4,500 Joules (3,319 ft lbs), or else be zeroed at 200 yards or on the Bisley Zero Range prior to being used at a longer distance. If your ME exceeds the limit then you must zero your rifle, using the specially designed target, the day before the start of your particular Meeting

Squadding: All entries made prior to the deadline will be allocated (squadded) to a specific time slots during the weekend which will be communicated to you via email. Squadding is subject to change right up until the collection of your scorecards, so please follow your squadding link for details of any updates

"Unsquadded" events: Any entries made during the Meetings will be unsquadded. Entries made before the deadline may also contain events listed without a time slot, this indicates there is no availability to squad them at the present time. These events are fully refundable once the unused scorecards have been returned to the NRA reception by the end of the Meeting. Competitors are responsible for speaking to Range Officers to fit into any gaps on range. The NRA team can assist in advising when there may be on the range availability

Scorecards: Affix the corresponding squadding sticker (provided in your scorecard pack) to the top of each scorecard. Once scores have been agreed, please sign the card and place it into the scorecard box (on the Range Officer table) before leaving the range

Results: Results will be input on the day of the Competition and will be available online: www.nra.org.uk/liveresults

Challenging Results: It is the competitor's responsibility on the day of the competition to ensure that scores are written down correctly before being signed by the Range Officer and posted in the scorecard box. Any challenges to scores before they are signed off must be made immediately to the Range Team on the day

- o During the Meeting provisional results will be periodically published online
- Once the Meeting has finished no edits can be made for competitor errors on the scorecards. Following the publishing of scores online competitors have until midday on the Thursday of the following week to contact the NRA for errors relating to the digitising of the hand recorded scores. Please email competitions@nra.org.uk with any challenges

Awards: NRA awards are presented to the top scoring competitors in each match, subject to the amount of entries:

First place: when an event is contested by 2 or more individuals, will receive an NRA Silver Shoulder medal, a Gold

Trafalgar Bar & a Prize Certificate. Trophies are awarded in certain matches, indicated by the
symbol on the entry form. Trophies are only presented when an event is contested by two or more individuals

Second place: when an event has 6 or more results, will receive a Prize Certificate **Third place:** when an event has 11 or more results, will receive a Prize Certificate

All Competitors may also purchase Skilled Shot Certificates after the Meeting if they achieve a certain score (see individual match details for more information). Skilled Shot Certificates cost £1.50 each

The Trafalgar Letter: A framed copy of a letter written during the battle of Trafalgar will be presented to the winner of a specific match. This year the award is to be presented to match 2891: 25m Slowfire Miniature/Pistol Calibre Rifle

▼ Match Director's award: A framed picture presented by the Match Director in recognition of a person/ person's contribution to the Trafalgar Meeting

Prizegiving: Will take place on Sunday 19th October at 6pm in the NRA Pavilion. All individual first place bars and medals will be presented, in addition to any Trophies. Once the results are finalised first, second and third place certificates will be posted out along with any uncollected bars and medals.

Firearms Usage: The NRA is required to keep a record of firearms used by competitors as required by the Firearms (Amendment) Acts 1997. Following a Competition please go to your online profile and update your firearms usage: online.nra.org.uk/customer/firearmusages

Terms of Entry:

- I agree I meet the entry requirements as stated in these Event Notes
- I confirm that the information given on the attached Entry form is true, complete and accurate

Access to firearms:

- I meet at least one of the following conditions that legitimises my access to firearms:
 - o I am an individual member of the NRA (or temporary 'Meeting Member' by paying the Non-Member Fee)
 - o I hold a Firearm Certificate or GB Visitor's Firearm Permit permitting me to use, for target shooting, the firearms that I shall fire in this event
 - o I am a member of a Club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI and will be shooting as a member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')

Warnings:

- I agree to abide by the rules of the National Rifle Association and I will accept the decisions of the Event Director or the NRA as final
- I agree that results of the Competition and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere containing my name, competitor number, country, class and score
- I agree that I have read the NSC Range Regulations in regards to the wearing of ear protection, and Appendix III of the NRA Handbook in regards to the wearing of eye protection, and shall not hold the organiser responsible for any injury resulting from non-compliance therewith. Any mandatory details will be contained within these Event Notes
- I understand that if I have debts to NRA or NSC Ltd over 90 days outstanding, entry to this event will be restricted until these have been settled in full
