Ready Position: Standing Alert unless otherwise specified

Competition 1: Based on 200 Yard Match, Stage 2

			
200x	10 Rounds	Sitting	2x Figure 11

Course of Fire: Competitors start in the sitting position. The target will make 1x exposure of 60 seconds. On appearance of the target, firers will engage the targets with 10 rounds. A maximum of 5 hits will count on each target

Competition 2:

			
200x	10 Rounds	Prone	Figure 11

Course of Fire: Competitors start in the prone position. The target will make 1x exposure of 60 seconds. On appearance of the target firers will engage the target with 10 rounds

Competition 3: Urban Match, Stage 2

			
100x	10 Rounds	Kneeling/ Squatting	Figure 11

Course of Fire: The target will make 2x exposures of 30 seconds. On appearance of the target, firers engage with 5 rounds from the kneeling or squatting position. There will be intervals of 15 seconds between exposures. Firers must return to the ready position between exposures

Ties: Competition standings by the greatest number of Xs, then in practice order from last to first. Overall Round standings will be counted back in Competition order: 1, 2, 3

Autumn: Monday 1st September – Sunday 30th November 2025

Programme: Full details can be found on the competition-specific scorecard

- **Competition 1:** Based on 200 yard Match, S2
- **Competition 2:** 200x Precision
- **Competition 3:** Based on Imperial Match, S8

Entry Fee: £3 per Class

Discount: 40% Off Entry Fees for those that are under 25 years old on the last day of the Competition

Entry Deadline: Sunday 30th November 2025 at midnight. All scorecards and entry payments must be submitted by this time

Cancellations: Once an entry is submitted it is non-refundable

General Event Information:

This event is governed by the rules laid out in the **2025 Civilian Service Rifle & Practical Rifle Handbook** and in turn the NRA Handbook. Please ensure you are familiar with the rules of the competition. If you have any queries please contact competitions@nra.org.uk

League Structure:

- **League:** A League season runs from 1st Sep - 31st August, and is split into four Rounds
- **Round:** Each Round lasts for 3 months and is comprised of 2-3 unique Competitions

Entry Requirements:

- ✓ As competitors will compete at their own Club ranges, it is the responsibility of each competitor to ensure they have the correct certification to be on the range
- ✓ This competition is open to members of Home Office Approved Clubs (HOAC) who are not prohibited under section 21 of the Firearms Act (The NRA is the largest HOAC in the UK)
- ✓ Non-NRA members are welcome to enter, there is no additional fee
- ✓ Probationary Members can also take part, providing they are supervised as per their Club's probationary policy

CSR Classes: The League will be contested in four separate CSR Classes as set out in the [CSR Handbook](#). Please refer to the handbook for full details of each class

- **Historic Enfield:** Any SMLE/ No.4/ No. 5 rifle, service pattern as issued, with no attachments
- **Any Iron:** Any rifle with iron sights, with no restriction on slings (but rests may not be used)
- **Practical Optic:** Any rifle with optic sights, with no restriction on slings or rests. If any rest is utilised it must remain fitted to the rifle at all times during the match
- **Service Optic:** Any rifle with optic sights, max 4.5 magnification with no restriction on slings. Rests may not be used. (Any vertical or angled fore grip, if fitted, may be used)

In each class there are the following sub-classes: **U17, U21, U25, Serving** Military/Reserve/Emergency Services, **Ex-Serving** Military/Reserve/Emergency Services

Dress & Equipment: As per the CSR Handbook

Targetry: The course of fire will advise the target face that is required for each competition. Where an electronic version of the target is available and is appropriate for the course of fire, this is permitted to be used

Courses of Fire: Conditions and courses of fire are listed on the Course of Fire pdf (available online). If you have any queries please email competitions@nra.org.uk

Taking Part: The E-League Competitions are intended to be contested at your local club – you will need to arrange an appropriate range booking so you can take part. All competitors are to abide by the rules of the range and instruction from Range Officers or other Officials

Making an entry: Firstly you will need to download a scorecard via the online event page when the event opens for bookings. Once completed this should be returned by sending it by email to competitions@nra.org.uk or post to the NRA, but it must arrive before the entry deadline. Shooters are only required to send a picture of their actual target if they achieve a Highest Possible Score (HPS)

Pre-Nominating: Before shooting your chosen Competition, the shooter must advise a witness that they intend to shoot their chosen E-League Competition. Scores cannot be claimed without pre-nominating

Re-Shoots: You may only enter each Competition once – i.e. once per firearm type. You may practice as many times as you like before nominating the scorecard that you intend to be entered

Concurrent Entries: You cannot contest the E-League Competition by submitting concurrent scores from any other competitive event with a matching course of fire

Scoring and Gauging: If the edge of a shot hole comes in contact with the scoring ring of a target, the shot is given at the higher value (inward gauging). Score values will be detailed on specific Competitions scorecards

Ties: Overall Round standings will be counted back in Competition order: 1, 2, 3

Gallery Rifle ID (GRID): This is a unique index number that allows us to match up your scores from multiple NRA Competitions. Your GRID is listed on your membership profile and on our online booking website: online.nra.org.uk/customer/info. If you are not yet in possession of a GRID number this will be issued to you upon entry

Results: Results will be input by NRA staff whose office hours are Monday – Friday 8-5pm. We will endeavour to upload scores as quickly as they are received. They will be available online via: nra.org.uk/e-league-results/

Challenging Results: It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that scores are written down correctly before being confirmed by the Witness and sent to the NRA. Any challenges to scores before they are signed off must be made immediately to the Witness on the day

- Once scorecards are submitted no edits can be made for competitor errors on the scorecards. Following the publishing of scores online competitors have until 5pm on Thursday 4th December to contact the NRA for errors relating to the digitising of the hand recorded scores. Please email competitions@nra.org.uk with any challenges

Awards: NRA Civitas Medals are awarded to the top scoring competitors in each Round of the E-League, subject to the amount of entries:

- 2+ entries: **1st** Place
- 6+ entries: **1st** and **2nd** Place
- 11+ entries: **1st, 2nd** and **3rd** Place

A Civitas medal will also be awarded to the 1st place competitor in each of the following sub-classes:

- Under 17
- Under 21
- Under 25
- Serving Member of HM forces/ Emergency Services
- Ex-Serving Member of HM forces/ Emergency Services

Prizegiving: There is no Prizegiving for this Round. Once the results are finalised the medals will be sent for engraving, and will be posted to their recipients

Access to firearms:

- I meet at least one of the following conditions that legitimise my access to firearms:
 - I am an individual member of the NRA
 - I hold a Firearm Certificate or GB Visitor's Firearm Permit permitting me to use, for target shooting, the firearms that I shall fire in this event
 - I am a member of a Club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI and will be shooting as a member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 as amended
- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')

Eligibility

- On the first day of the Event I will be aged fourteen years or over; OR I have the written approval of the NRA and the Event director to participate notwithstanding my age.
- I certify that I am qualified to participate in accordance with the Regulations and hold a current certificate of Safety and Competence, which I will present at the Event
- I am an individual member of the NRA; or by virtue of at least one of the following I meet the criteria to be granted, and I apply for, temporary membership of the NRA for the duration of the Event:
 - I hold a UK Firearm Certificate, GB Visitor's Firearm Permit or Permit under S7 Firearms Act 1968 authorising possession of a full-bore rifle, small-bore rifle or muzzle-loading pistol
 - I am a full member of a club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI
 - I am a present member of HM Forces and have current military certification of competence with a full-bore rifle

Warnings:

- I agree that I have been warned that ear protection must and eye protection may be required to be worn at all times in the vicinity of all firing points while shooting is in progress, and shall not hold the organiser responsible for any injury resulting from non-compliance therewith. Any mandatory details will be contained within the specific Event Notes for each Event
- I agree to abide by the rules of the National Rifle Association and of the Event and I will accept the decisions of the Event Director or the NRA as final
- I agree that results of a Competition and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere containing my name, competitor number, class and score
- I understand that if I have debts to NRA or NSC Ltd over 90 days outstanding, squadding cards will not be issued to me until these have been settled in full
