Programme & Entry Fees:

 **Saturday 4th July:** Falling Plates (PM) **£23/ Team** Under 25 Team* **£14**

***Under 25 Discount:** 40% discount off entry fee when all members of the team are under 25 years old, or in full time education on the day of the Event

Non-Member Fee: £17.00 per person – applicable to all members of the team. This will not be charged if the individual has already paid the fee as part of their Individual CSR Imperial entry

Entry Deadline: Monday 22nd June at midday

Cancellations: Cancellations must be received via email to competitions@nra.org.uk by **8am Thursday 2nd July**. Entries will be fully refunded (or credited) before this time, after this point entries are non-refundable. Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of cancellation

Entry Requirement Summary (See Terms of Entry below for full details):

- ✓ **Membership:** This competition is open to NRA Members. Shooters from other Home Office Approved Clubs are welcome but are required to pay the Non-Member Fee
- ✓ **Shooter Certification Card (SCC):** In either Telescope Rifle or Iron Sighted Rifle (depending on which class of firearm you are competing in. If not in possession of a suitable SCC, shooters should email competitions@nra.org.uk before entering to apply for a temporary card
- ✓ **Age:** On the first day of the event, you must be aged 14 or over - please contact the event Competitions Team before entering if this is not the case

Classes:

- Modern: Any pattern designed from 1955 to present
- Historic: Any pattern pre-1955 design using Iron Sights and chambered in the correct calibre for the firearm as was issued). Bipods not permitted. The course of fire will include a reduced 25 yard rundown, and all rifles must be shot prone unsupported – i.e. the use of bipods or a magazine to rest the firearm is prohibited

Making an entry: Entries can be made and paid for online via: online.nra.org.uk. A downloadable paper entry form will also be available which can be returned via email or post

Team Names: Please ensure you provide a team name upon entry. A list of team members must be provided to the competitions team no later than the start of shooting

Courses of Fire: Conditions and courses of fire are listed in the CSR Handbook which can be found [online](#) and in a FREE paperback book available from NRA Reception

Firing Positions: Prone, sitting, kneeling and standing. Para A3.2.22 of the CSR Handbook: A firer who has a physical disability (temporary or permanent) which prevents the use of a position specified in the match conditions may assume the next most difficult position instead. The CRO, RO and the MD must be informed before the start of the match. The following substitutions are among those permitted:

- a. The sitting position instead of the prone position
- b. The kneeling position instead of the sitting position
- c. The standing position instead of the kneeling position
- d. The kneeling unsupported position (either on two knees or on one knee without resting the elbow on the knee) instead of the standing position

Muzzle Energy: Ranges at Bisley use the Danger Area of Pirbright Range, which under MoD requirements state that all firearms used must either have a muzzle energy under 4,500 Joules (3,319 ft lbs), or else be zeroed at 200 yards or on the Bisley Zero Range prior to being used at a longer distance. If your ME exceeds the limit then you must zero your rifle, using the specially designed target, the day before the start of your particular Meeting

- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')

Warnings:

- I agree that results of the Competition and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere containing my name, competitor number, country, class and score
