Entry Requirement Summary (*See Terms of Entry below for full details*):

- ✓ **Membership:** This competition is open to NRA Members. Shooters from other Home Office Approved Clubs are welcome but are required to pay the Non-Member Fee
- ✓ **Shooter Certification Card (SCC):** In the firearm type you are due to compete with. If not in possession of a suitable SCC, shooters should email competitions@nra.org.uk before entering to apply for a temporary card
- ✓ **Age:** On the first day of the event, you must be aged 14 or over - please contact the event Competitions Team before entering if this is not the case

Entry Deadline: Monday 13th July at midday

Cancellations: Cancellations must be received via email to competitions@nra.org.uk by **8am Friday 17th July** Entries will be fully refunded (or credited) before this time, after this point entries are non-refundable. Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of cancellation

Making an entry: Entries can be made and paid for online via: online.nra.org.uk. A PDF version of the entry form will also be available from the webpage, which can be returned via email or post

Overseas Competitors: Applications for Visitors Firearms Permits should be made at your earliest opportunity, as it can take up to 3 months to be processed. Please use the Visitors Firearms Permit application form available as a download on the NRA website. Competitors from within the European Community must include a valid European Firearms Pass where applicable

Rules: ISSF clothing rules apply, except for NRA TR Rifles. All ISSF events qualify for British Records

Ammunition: Maximum calibre 8mm, subject to Range Safety Rules

Rifle Classes:

- Free Rifles: Maximum weight of 8kg, no trigger weight limitation other than being safe
- Standard Rifle: Maximum weight of 5.5kg, minimum trigger weight of 1.5kg
- NRA Target Rifle: : Maximum weight 6.5kg, minimum trigger weight of 1.5kg

Muzzle Energy: Ranges at Bisley use the Danger Area of Pirbright Range, which under MoD requirements state that all firearms used must either have a muzzle energy under 4,500 Joules (3,319 ft lbs), or else be zeroed at 200 yards or on the Bisley Zero Range prior to being used at a longer distance. If your ME exceeds the limit then you must zero your rifle, using the specially designed target, the day before the start of your particular Meeting

Targets: Electronic 300m Rifle Target

- Scoring ring values 1 – 9 are printed in the scoring zones, in diagonal lines at right angles to each other. The 10-point zone is not marked with a number

10 Ring	100 mm	(±0.5 mm)	5 Ring	600 mm	(±3.0 mm)
9 Ring	200 mm	(±1.0 mm)	4 Ring	700 mm	(±3.0 mm)
8 Ring	300 mm	(±1.0 mm)	3 Ring	800 mm	(±3.0 mm)
7 Ring	400 mm	(±3.0 mm)	2 Ring	900 mm	(±3.0 mm)
6 Ring	500 mm	(±3.0 mm)	1 Ring	1000 mm	(±3.0 mm)

Courses of Fire: Prone, 15 minutes for sighting, followed by 60 shots in 60 minutes

Squadding: Prior to the start of the competition you will be emailed with a copy of your squadding. If you are taking part in the Target Rifle Imperial Meeting please indicate this when entering so we can aim to deconflict your squadding

When you Arrive: Please report directly to the 300m shed – located on the left-hand side of Century range, ideally 15 minutes before your event start time

Challenging Results: It is the competitor's responsibility on the day of the competition to ensure that scores are recorded correctly. Any challenges must be made to the Range Officer on the day of the event

Awards: NRA Medals are presented for each Competition, and in each Aggregate, subject to the amount of entries:

- 2+ entries: Gold Medal
- 6+ entries: Gold and Silver Medal
- 11+ entries: Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal

Prizegiving: 300m Championship medals and trophies will be presented at the Main Imperial Prizegiving on Saturday 25th July at 18:00 in the marquee on Exhibition Lawn

Firearms Usage: The NRA is required to keep a record of firearms used by competitors as required by the Firearms (Amendment) Acts 1997. Following a Competition please go to your online profile and update your firearms usage:

 - I am a member of a Club Approved by the Home Office, the Scottish Ministers or the PSNI and will be shooting as a member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I am not a prohibited person within the meaning of Section 21 Firearms Act 1968 (as amended)
- I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential')
